

Athens Marathon

About

The marathon race (26.2 miles) follows the steps of the legendary Phidippides, from the town of Marathon

The modern race is based on a legend, when a messenger named Phidippides ran over twenty-four miles to Athens, carrying news of a great victory of the soldiers of Athens over an invading Persian Army.

On June 23, 1894, French educator Baron Pierre de Coubertin proposed that the ancient Games be revived on an international scale

The modern marathon commemorates this epic run every year, and celebrates the battle as a victory for democracy and for the preservation of western civilization.

Venue now offers 10 km, 5 km and Power Walking events

The first (modern) Olympiad was celebrated in 1896, where an estimated 245 athletes from 14 nations competed in the ancient stadium before enthusiastic crowds.
